POLICY:

Trustbridge will allow in-person visitation while a patient is in a Trustbridge facility.

Trustbridge will establish and make available for visitors infection control and education practices, including, but not limited to screening, personal protective equipment, other infection control protocols, permissible length of visits, and number of visitors allowed in a room at the facility.

Care Center Manager or designee will be responsible for ensuring that employees adhere to in-person visitation policies and/or procedures.

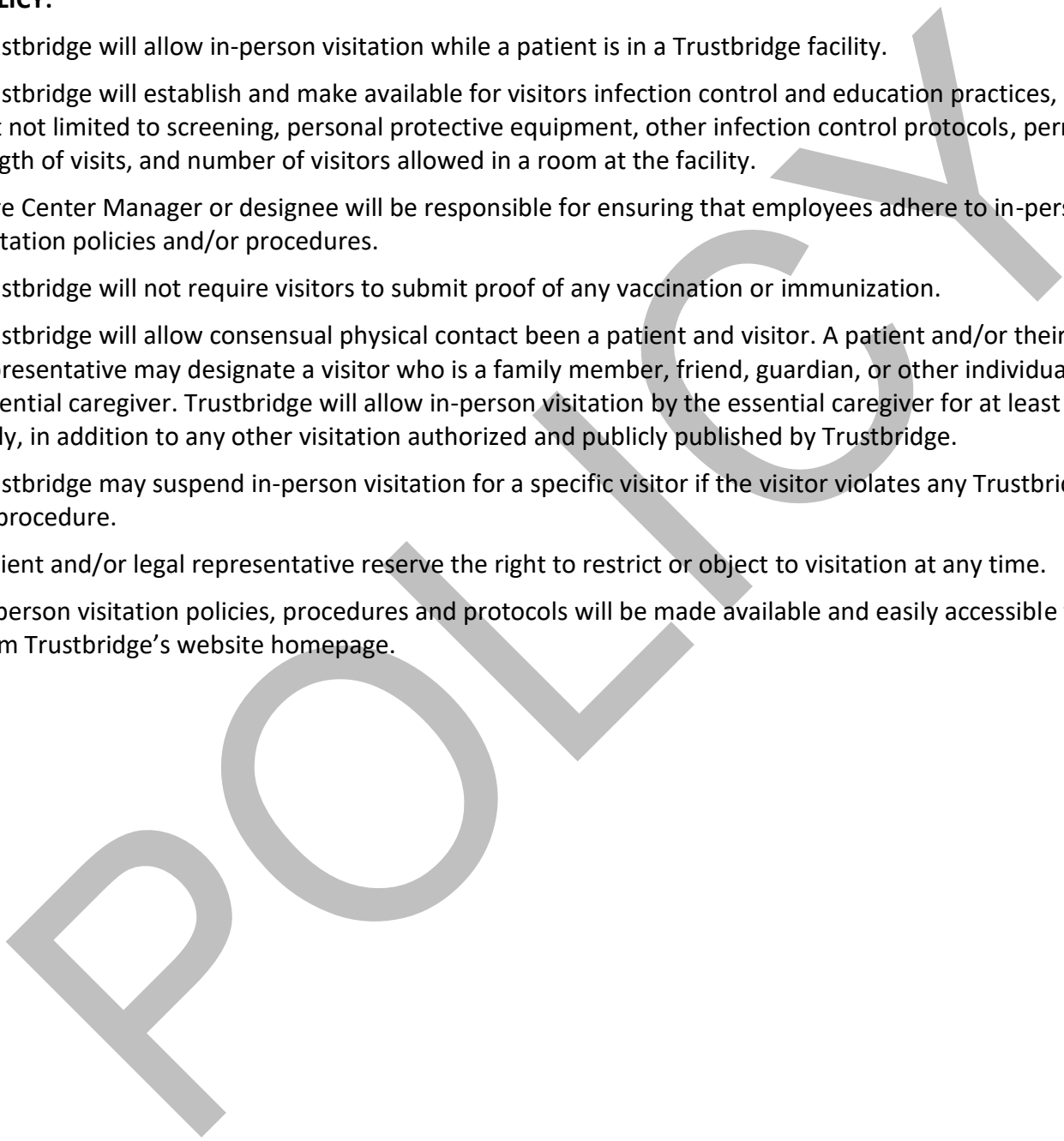
Trustbridge will not require visitors to submit proof of any vaccination or immunization.

Trustbridge will allow consensual physical contact between a patient and visitor. A patient and/or their legal representative may designate a visitor who is a family member, friend, guardian, or other individual as an essential caregiver. Trustbridge will allow in-person visitation by the essential caregiver for at least 2 hours daily, in addition to any other visitation authorized and publicly published by Trustbridge.

Trustbridge may suspend in-person visitation for a specific visitor if the visitor violates any Trustbridge policy or procedure.

Patient and/or legal representative reserve the right to restrict or object to visitation at any time.

In-person visitation policies, procedures and protocols will be made available and easily accessible for visitors from Trustbridge’s website homepage.
